
Our Nation's True Pledge—since 1776

The following images come from a digitized version of Samuel Johnson's 1756 dictionary.




CO'RPORATE, *a.* [from *corpus*, Latin.]



As we see from the 1756 definitions, governments are simply a form of **corporation**. When viewed as corporations, the correct government charters become apparent.

There are two primary corporate charters, whether commercial or government. Those charters are:

The Founding Charter, which identifies the owners and the contractually enforceable terms among themselves and how they will control their corporation — or **government** in this instance. It primarily identifies:

- the owners (citizens/the governed, and taxpayers)
- the controllers (registered voters)
- who is eligible to vote and how to counted the votes

The By-Laws, the law over government, is simply the job description sheet for all levels of key corporate officers:

- **legislative**
- **executive, and**
- **judicial**

What are the RULES for controlling our government?

The Founding Charter, which is *The unanimous Declaration of the united States of America*, contains these simple rules with some of the critical highlights below:

- *purpose of government*: That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men,
- *vote-count method*: deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed... ***not the majority of those who simply submit a ballot; not simply by obtaining one more vote than the other.***
- ***recall elections***: That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it...
- *grant only those powers necessary for government to do its job honorably*: Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes...
- ***do not get comfortable with "minor" political evils***: All experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed...
- ***when past generations fail to keep government under proper control***: But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government....
- *the list of nearly 30 grievances within The Declaration are powers that by every act which may define a Tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people; and are prohibited to us to grant or allow government to exercise over us.*
- *our nation's entire foreign, war, and trade policy*; we

hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

- *defines representative limitations as*; the Representatives of the united States of America [...] do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People. ***Representatives have no personal vote in the office they fill. They are duty bound to vote in accord with the majority of the total number of registered voters in their district — even if the representative morally disagrees. The only exception is if The Constitution does not authorize the action.***
- ***ending with our nation's true pledge to each other***: And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

Government Officers owe their allegiance to the people by way of their oath to The Constitution

From *The Constitution of the United States of America*, Article 6:

"This Constitution, and the Laws of the United States which shall be made in Pursuance thereof; and all Treaties made, or which shall be made, under the Authority of the United States, shall be the supreme Law of the Land; and the Judges in every State shall be bound thereby, any Thing in the Constitution or Laws of any State to the Contrary notwithstanding.

"The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and the Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both of the United States and of the several States, shall be bound by Oath or Affirmation, to support this Constitution...."
